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# Purpose

The purpose of this manual is to assist you in operating and maintaining your Riata Rake. Read it carefully. It furnishes information and instructions that will help you achieve years of dependable performance.

These instructions have been compiled from field experience and engineering data. Some information may be general in nature, due to unknown and varying operating conditions. However, through experience and these instructions, you should be able to develop procedures suitable to your particular situation.

The illustrations and data used in this manual were current at the time of printing. However, due to possible production changes, your machine may vary slightly in detail. We reserve the right to redesign and change the machines as may be necessary without notification.

Throughout this manual, references are made to right and left direction. These are determined by standing behind the Power Unit facing the direction of forward travel.



• Keep all persons away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service, or maintenance.

• Tighten all bolts, nuts, and screws to torque

chart specifications. Check that all cotter pins are installed securely to ensure equipment is in a safe condition before putting unit into service.


## **Assembly Instruction**

(Purchaser's Responsibility) Inspect the equipment thoroughly before assembly to be certain it is complete and undamaged. This pictorial purchaser assembly guide should be followed sequentially during setup.

> TIME REQUIRED: 30 Minutes Riata Rake arrives bolted to a heavy duty pallet. Assemble on level ground with room to move around the implement.

> Remove Owners Manual from tube. Read and follow all instructions.

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
# REMOVE PALLET SIDE/CROSS BRACING

Removing the side bracing and cross bracing will provide access to assemble Riata Rake.



# DISCARD PALLET BRACING


Removing the side bracing and cross bracing will provide access to assemble Riata Rake.



# REMOVE THE LAG BOLTS

Remove all lag bolts attached in tine bar and rear comb.





#### **DEALER INSTRUCTIONS**

LIFT THE REAR COMB FRAME PLACE ON THE GROUND Caution—Make sure the ground you have the pallet on is level.



Place rear comb to the rear of the rake for attachment to the frame.



Place rear comb under rear bracket—place carriage bolts in from bottom of comb—Tighten securely. (two person operation)



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Cut tie wrap and remove the Operators Manual Tube from yoke.



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
Attach tongue to rake yoke frame using hex bolts and nut








Alternatively, you can attach the tongue by rotating yoke over the top of rear comb.


Attach to power unit ball (fork lift shown) for attaching the tines to the tine bar. Lock coupler into position on ball.







# **DEALER INSTRUCTIONS**

Attach all tines, insert through tine hole from the bottom of the tine bar using washers and spring clips to secure the tine into position.







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Attach the Owners Manual tube on tongue.



# Set the level of the tine bar

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Using a level for initial set up, make sure the tine bar is level front to back. This will ensure that the front and rear tines are at exactly the same depth in the footing.



#### FINAL SETUP IN ARENA

Now you are ready to connect your Riata Rake to the vehicle. The two turnbuckles determine the level of the tine bar and the angle of the rear comb. Make sure you set the rear comb so that it allows the tines to be in suspension between your receiver and the rear comb.

## Set the depth of the tines

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We recommend that you place electrical tape on the two outside tines to establish a visual indication of depth. If you desire 1.5" depth, place the bottom edge of the tape at 1.5" from the bottom of the tine. Adjust the turnbuckles so that you achieve your desired depth and be sure the tine bar is level.



After this set up, you should only need to raise the wheels and axel assembly using the side crank jack to raise and lower the implement.

# **Pre-Delivery**

#### **Dealer Checklist**

(Purchaser's Responsibility)

Inspect the equipment thoroughly after assembly to be certain it is set up properly before delivering it to the customer. The following check list is a reminder of points to inspect.

Check off each item if it is found satisfactory or after proper adjustment is made.

\_\_\_\_\_ Check that all safety decals are installed and in good condition. Replace if damaged.

Check all bolts to be sure they are tight. Check that all cotter pins and safety pins are properly installed.

It is important for the dealer to visually check and make sure all parts are in tact prior to delivery to customer.

\_\_\_\_\_ Show customer the safe, proper procedures to be used when mounting, dismounting, and storing equipment.

\_\_\_\_\_ Show customer how to make adjust-ments.

\_\_\_\_ Check that tires are inflated and wheels are greased.

Present Operator's Manual and request that customer and all operators read it before operating equipment. Point out the manual safety rules, explain their meanings and emphasize the increased safety hazards that exist when safety rules are not followed. Point out the safety decals. Explain their meaning and the need to keep them in place and in good condition. Emphasize the increased safety hazards when instructions are not followed.

Explain to customer the potential crushing hazards of going underneath raised equipment. Instruct customer that service work does not require going underneath unit and never to do so.

Complete the Warranty Registration located in the back of the owners manual. Make a copy and email to riata at sales@riataranch. com subject "New Warranty Registration".

The operator is responsible for the safe operation of this equipment. The operator must be properly trained. Operators should be familiar with the equipment, the Power Unit, and all safety practices before starting operation. Read the safety rules and safety decals on pages 2-6.

Owner should check and tighten all hardware after the first hour of operation. The break in stage of your new Riata Rake can cause minimal loosening of hardware. Please see Bolt Torque Chart (page 13) for proper torque infor-

\_\_\_\_ Check that all safety decals are installed and in good condition. Replace if damaged.

\_\_\_\_ Check that all hardware is properly installed and secured.

\_\_\_ Do not allow riders.

Make sure Power Unit ROPS or ROPS CAB (when applicable) and seat belt are in good condition. Keep seat belt securely fastened during operation.

\_\_\_\_\_ Check that tires are inflated and wheels are greased.

\_\_\_\_\_ Check and regularly grease all 3 grease zerks, (2) Wheels, (1) jack.

# ADJUSTING YOUR TINE DEPTH




Figure 4, Tine Depth Adjustment

Your Riata Rake is equipped with a tine bar array and a dual adjustment (see figure 4 below).

One way of determining the depth that is best suited for your arena is to adjust the tine bar by extending the both turnbuckles until the tines are in the footing of your arena. Now continue to adjust the depth until you begin to see the rake frame raise off the ground—this is easy to detect if you watch the rear comb. Now raise the tines until the rear comb is solidly in the footing material.

This position depth is the lowest possible position at that location in your arena that the tine can be pulled. It is up to your particular sport and your footing preferences to determine the depth for your arena footing but as a rule of thumb, 1 1/2" - 2 1/2 " depth is typical for most equestrian sports. You should not attempt this method of depth setting if your arena is a deep sand arena.

WHEEL HEIGHT SETTING

Your Riata Rake has adjustable wheel heights positions.

The wheels on your Riata Rake are designed to function as gauge wheels and they work to keep your arena level. The correct wheel position is elevated approximately 1 -2" above the surface of your arena footing. Do not carry significant load while in operation. You may see daylight under them at times—this is correct. They keep the tines from following any low areas in your base to provide a method for leveling the base as well as the footing.

Use the side crank jack to adjust the wheel height position.

# **A**CAUTION

HITCH CHECK: **The Riata Rake is equipped for use with a 1 7/8" Ball**. Always confirm which ball size your coupler requires. Be sure the Ball Hitch is secured and in a locked position.

BEFORE DISENGAGING BALL COUPLE FROM BALL, BE SURE REAR COMB IS ON THE GROUND

SET UP THE RIATA RAKE

Leveling frame:

Use the two turnbuckles to set the tine bar level and at the proper depth. The tine bar should be set at parallel to the earth in a horizontal position.

Be sure that the tine bar is level. This is key to excellent footing. Be sure that the tines are at the appropriate depth for your arena and equine sport.

# **IMPORTANT** Never back your Riata Rake With Rake In Ground!

OPERATING GROUND SPEED:

It is recommended that the machine be operated at 4-6mph. Do not operate at a speed which will cause the rear comb to come off the surface of the arena. If this occurs reduce your speed.


GROUND SPEED WHILE TRANSPORTING:

Never transport unit (wheels in full down position) over 4 mph. Do not operate at a speed which will cause the unit to bounce. If this occurs, immediately reduce your speed.


## Storage


